## RECYCLING ROUNDUP

## CENTRE COUNTY SELLS ALL ITS RECYCLEABLES

If you think recyclables just end up in landfills, look at what Centre County does with our recyclables. These pictures show the bales of recyclables that are sold to companies that put them to good use. The baling machine was a \$450.000 investment. Each bail is 5' long, 40" wide and 30" high and weights up to 1100 pounds.



Bales of corrugated cardboard are popular items among buyers. Help by breaking down your boxes. Out time is cheap but theirs is not. Mixed paper is baled separately. This includes cereal boxes, newspapers, magazines, envelopes, and letters.

Bailed plastic used to make plastic lumber. Please rinse before recycling them.



All glass bottles end up at the Owens-Brockway plant in Brockway, PA. where the bottles are sorted, ground, and converted into new glass bottles and jars. The glass pictured next is on a conveyor belt waiting to be picked up cans are bailed separately. A giant magnet

pulls steel cans from aluminum cans (pictured below).

Centre County is unique for its preparation of recyclables. Ours do not end up in landfills. Help out the County by giving them everything you have to work with. Their warehouse full of bales turns over often.

# **CULINARY**CORNER

The dog days of summer are well upon us. Nothing helps beat the heat more than a cool frozen dessert.

There is a large variety of frozen treats to choose from. What exactly consti-



tutes a frozen dessert? Technically it is a dessert made by freezing flavored liquids, sometimes with solids added for texture. This month I will highlight and explain some of the more popular dishes you can enjoy on a hot August day.

**Ice cream** – easily the most popular variety. Ice cream is a dairy based dessert that contains between 10 – 16% butterfat. The high butterfat and air whipped into it gives that familiar smooth, creamy texture we all love

Frozen custard – a dairy based frozen dessert that also contains egg yolks for added richness. Less air is incorporated during freezing which creates a rich, dense creamy texture.

Gelato - think ice cream that is a little richer and denser. Often flavored with fruit purees

Frozen yogurt – a low fat alternative to traditional ice cream. A tangy flavor profile is to be expected.

**Sorbet** – a frozen dessert with no dairy at all. Just sugar, fruit puree, water. A smooth fine texture is the result of churning while freezing.

Granite – a crunchy frozen dessert made with sugar, water, flavoring liquid. Granita's have a crunchy texture due to large ice crystals that form during the freezing process.

**Snow cones** – shaved ice flavored with a syrup. A summer time classic!

Try one style or all while the heat of summer is here. Enjoy!


