- "Bursting with appreciation for you" ~ microwave popcorn























Hello, my name is Thomas S. Hoy! I was raised in the family homestead in Lemont, PA and have fond memories of those growing-up years. I graduated from State College HS

in June, 1966 and enlisted in the USMC in May, 1967. I spent 4 years in the USMC, with 19 months of that time in Vietnam. Upon my return to civilian life, I enrolled at PSU and in August, 1973, graduated from PSU with an accounting degree. Thereafter, I worked for one of the "big eight" CPA firms in Pittsburgh and in September, 1975, I was hired by the FBI as a Special Agent. My ensuing career with the FBI was "exciting, challenging and adventurous" and I never minded getting up on Monday mornings to go to work! I retired from the FBI in July, 2004 and then immediately became re-employed with the FBI as a Special Investigator. In that position, I conducted background investigations (mostly at PSU) on prospective FBI employees. In February, 2015, I retired from the FBI again, with 40 years of total service. In April, 2010, I spent 6 months in Afghanistan doing Special Ops work with the US Army. In the winter of 2016, I drove a snow plow for PennDOT. I can only describe my current employment with The Village as "a hoot!!". It's such a pleasure to interact with these wonderful people. And The Village staff personnel have been wonderful as well. RECYCLING ROUNDUP

How to Make Up for the Decline in Newspaper Recycling

It's pretty simple. Recycle all of your waste paper. There is no need to separate envelopes from magazines, cracker boxes from newspapers, and so on. All paper, including newspapers, can be mixed together in one bag and then taken to your recycling/trash room in your apartment building where it can be dropped in a bin identified as the Mixed Paper bin. Cottage residents can place their mixed paper in a bag and the bag in your red bin for pick up each Wednesday.

Here's a partial list of the type of (unsoiled!) paper that makes up the Mixed Paper category:

Magazines Newspapers

Ad fliers Uncoated food boxes

Stationery Lightweight cardboard boxes

Post-Its Mail

Invoices Office paper Calendars Paper bags

Business cards Package inserts

Receipts Wrapping paper

Size does not matter. Color does not matter. Just toss that 2" X 3 ½" business card in with your Vogue magazine. In the end, all of the mixed paper is compacted and baled as such for the mills that process it into new boxes, newsprint, game boards, food packages, etc.

So, my recycling friends, the message this month is "Offset the decline in newspaper tonnage by recycling mixed paper. Bada bing bada boom!"
