month, the Alzheimer's Association encourages people around the globe to support the movement by wearing purple and training their brains to fight the disease.

5 FACTS ABOUT ALZHEIMER'S THAT YOU DIDN'T KNOW

- **1. Around the world** An estimated 47 million people around the world are living with Alzheimer's and other dementias, and if a change doesn't come by 2030, this number will grow to 76 million.
- **2. Each second counts** A person develops Alzheimer's disease in the United States every 65 seconds.
- **3. Caregivers** In America, more than 16 million people take care of family or friends with Alzheimer's or dementia, and that, too, without pay.
- **4. A leading disease** In the U.S., Alzheimer's is the sixth leading cause of death and 6.2 million of those living with Alzheimer's disease are over 65.
- **5. One out of three deaths** Alzheimer's or other dementia kills one in three seniors and deaths due to this disease are more than prostate cancer and breast cancer combined.

RECYCLING ROUNDUP

RECYCLING 102

A short course in identifying plastic cups that look like they are recyclable...BUT AREN'T!

You go to Wendy's and order a 20-ounce "cup" of Dr. Pepper at the drive-up window. Counter person gives you a plastic cup filled with soda, along with a plastic lid, and a plastic straw. When you arrive home, you put aside your three plastic items in order to recycle them, which you do the next time you head to the recycling room in your apartment building, or toss the three plastic items in your red recycling bin if you are a cottage resident. Thank you for your commitment to recycling! Sometimes, however, we can't win for losing. In this Dr. Pepper scenario, the plastic soda cup, lid and straw are not recyclable because Centre County Recycling Authority does not classify them as recyclables. There are too many varieties of plastic cups. Some can be recycled, some not; it's too complicated for Centre County Recycling to sort the recyclable cups from those that are not. Straws and lids are automatically trashed.

The Recycling 102 Message: Throw plastic soda cups, straws and lids in your trash container.

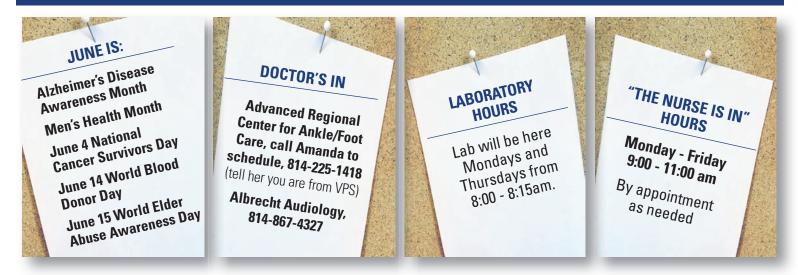
