## THE ED VIEW



The number of Americans living with Alzheimer's is growing — and growing fast. Nearly 7 million Americans have Alzheimer's.

As the size of the U.S. population age 65 and older continues to grow, so too will the number and proportion of Americans with Alzheimer's or other

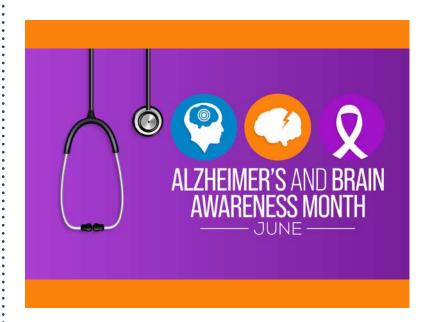
dementias. By 2050, the number of people age 65 and older with Alzheimer's may grow to a projected 12.7 million, barring the development of medical breakthroughs to prevent or cure Alzheimer's disease.

People age 65 and older survive an average of four to eight years after a diagnosis of Alzheimer's, yet some live as long as 20 years with Alzheimer's. This reflects the slow, uncertain progression of the disease.

June is Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month. This year, The Village will have a team supporting the fight against Alzheimer's. There will be a variety of activities planned including participating in the Alzheimer's walk. Make sure to watch the bulletins on CLC for Alzheimer team related announcements. # RECYCLING ROUNDUP

## **WE'RE ROCKIN'!**

It's rare for the current year-to-date (YTD) weight of each category of recyclables—plastic and metal containers; glass bottles, jugs, and jars; mixed paper, and corrugated cardboard—to exceed the YTD weight of each category in the previous year. But that's the April 2024 YTD story. Every cotton pickin' category of recyclables through April is ahead of April 2023 YTD. Here are the numbers:

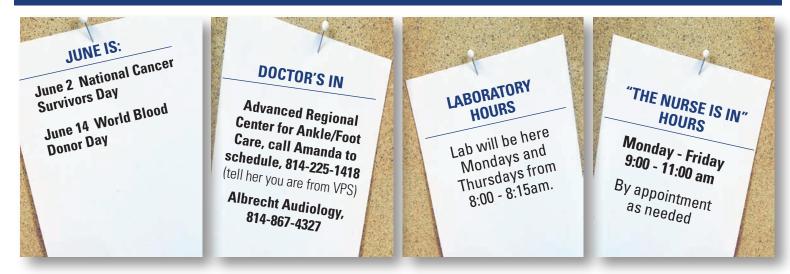
