

RECYCLING ROUNDUP

I'M BAA-ACK

This means your recycling czar will be singing the praises of recycling in the Village for another year. So let's get started on the right foot this first month of 2025. The variety of items that we residents can recycle in the ground-floor recycling/trash rooms in the apartment buildings and that cottage residents can place at curbside are as follows:

Mixed paper – Newspapers, magazines, mail, office stationery, bags, "plain" cardboard, and food boxes.

Corrugated cardboard – Flattened, if possible. If not, call Maintenance for take-away.

Metal food and beverage cans.

Glass bottles, jugs and jars – Lids on or off. If off, recycle them in metal bin.

Plastic bottles, jugs and jars – Lids on preferred.

Miscellaneous plastics – Containers used for foods, mostly. If it's plastic and does not have a narrow neck (bottle, jug, jar), it is to be dropped in a miscellaneous plastic bin in one of the recycling rooms in the apartment buildings. Cottage residents can comingle all of the plastics in one bin.

Plastic bags.


