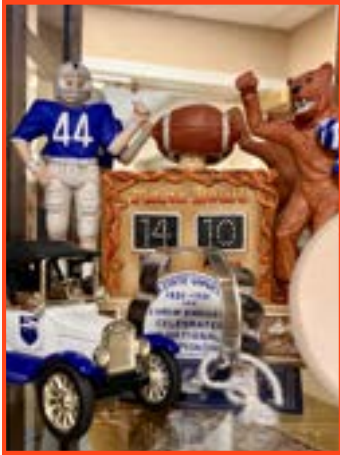

NOTE: There were a number of frosts during April. A very hard freeze on April 21st sent temperatures down into the upper teens in valleys and near 20 elsewhere. Most spring freezes damage leaves and most plants have enough energy to replace them. However, the severity of this freeze froze the sap running up through the cambium of many bushes and trees. Many plants cannot recover from such injuries, so with insufficient sap, they slowly die and have to be replaced.

RECYCLING ROUNDUP

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CORRUGATED CARDBOARD AND NON-CORRUGATED CARDBOARD?

Corrugated

Corrugated cardboard is a heavy-duty type of cardboard featuring a wavy (fluted) layer of paper glued in between two or more layers of liner paper, the combination of which provides extra strength. The inner layer acts as a shock absorber during transit. Best use is for shipping heavy items i.e., computer monitors, industrial equipment, and tools. (See photo.)

Non-Corrugated

A single, thick layer of heavy paper stock. Best uses: cereal and game boxes, cosmetic packaging and gift boxes. Often described as lightweight cardboard.

What do these two types of cardboard have in common?

Both types are recyclable and may be deposited in a recycling room located on the ground floor of each apartment building. Cottage residents may place flattened cardboard at curbside on collection day.

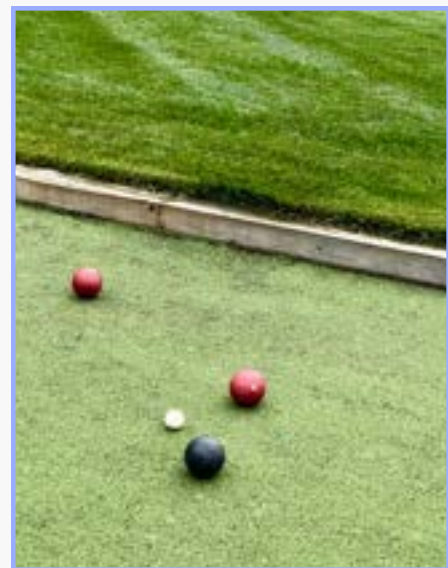
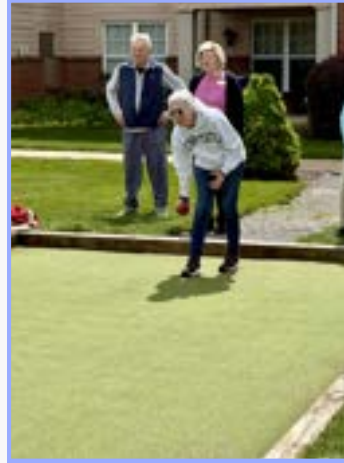

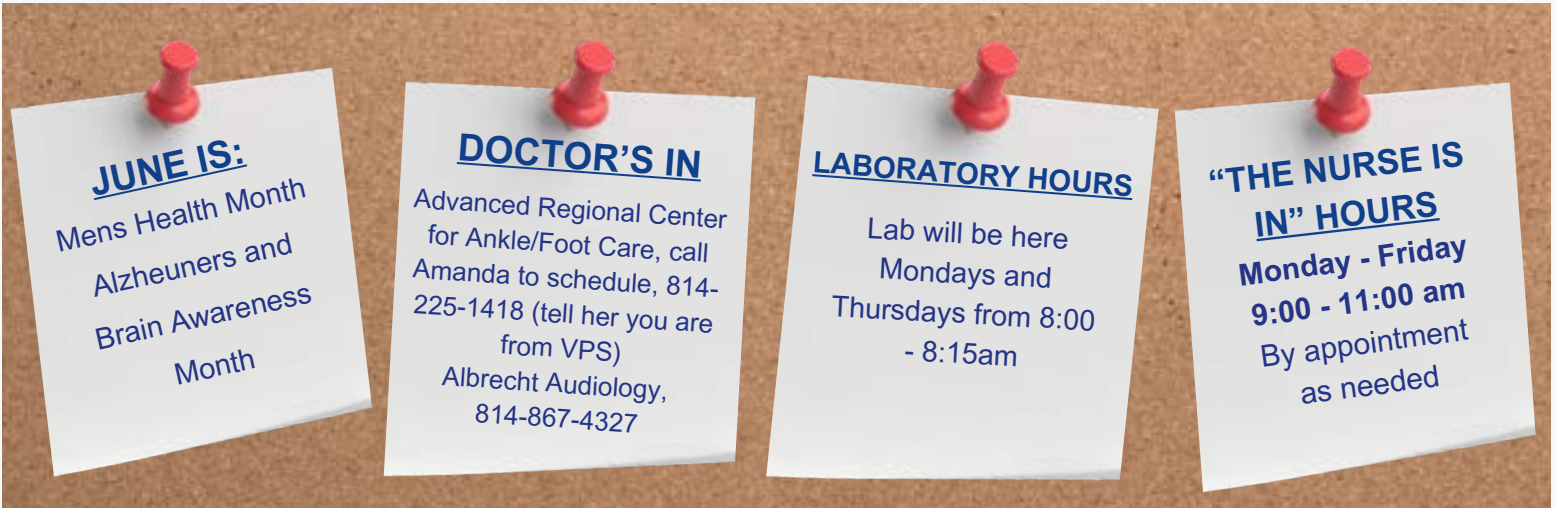
